**Authority:**

By the authority vested in me by the applicable provisions of the laws of the State of Alabama, including but not limited to Ala. Code §11-44B-7 (1975), pursuant to which the Mayor of the City as the Chief Executive Officer has the general supervision and control of all other officers and the affairs of the City, except as otherwise provided by law, I, Walter Maddox, as Mayor do hereby order and direct as follows:

That the Office of the City Attorney shall research and make recommendations to the Mayor regarding delinquent parking tickets, including prosecution of parking offenses in Municipal Court. James P. Woodson III, Senior Associate City Attorney, shall chair this committee which shall include Joe Robinson, Director, TDOT/City Engineer; Madelene Hollingsworth, Municipal Court Judge; Reginald Kennedy, TDOT; Carol Naylor, Municipal Court Clerk; and Ariel Blocker, Assistant City Attorney.

This committee shall report all findings to the Mayor in a written report no later than November 6, 2006.

**Implementation:**

All Departments of the City and their respective employees to whom this Executive Order applies shall forthwith implement the same in accordance with its terms and requirements. Nothing contained in this Order shall relieve a person from any requirement to obtain a license or other authorization in compliance with applicable laws and regulations. This Order is not intended to conflict with, supersede or contradict any lawful ordinance or resolution duly enacted by the City Council. This Order does not create any right, benefit, or privilege, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by a party against the City, its departments, agencies, entities, officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.
